Geobusters: Thanks to Morne for this article.

We had 9 geobusters and 6 parents / guardians in attendance for Geobusters 2 of 2023. We started off with an amazing show-and-tell where we saw some great examples of rocks and fossils from the area presented including:

petrified wood, a plesiosaur tooth, a huuuge megalodon tooth, a great agate from the Ashburton river, a life-size 3D printed Little Bush Moa, flint nodules from Kaikoura, a strange possible fossil in some limestone, a beautiful fossil crab, and many more.

The theme for the day was sedimentary rock and how the different layers can tell a story. After a short presentation on what sedimentary rocks are and what they look like in Canterbury, it was time to put our knowledge to the test!

Each young geologist was given a bucket containing a variety of rocks, fossils and artifacts placed in layers representing different age deposits. They had to sift these out and then order from oldest to youngest. After ordering them, this is the story they told:

This area had a volcanic eruption (angular rocks containing feldspar), some agates eroded from the volcanic host rock and were tumbled in a river or beach (round, polished agates). An ocean covered the region (crinoid stems) and then retreated and a forest grew (amber and petrified wood). The ocean once again covered the area (shark teeth and shells) before retreating and a forest coming back (kauri gum). Finally, humans arrived in the area (Victorian pennies and then modern coins).


There was a rush to the MicroEye to have a closer look at the amber they had found to see if there were any inclusions, such as insects, and to take a closer look at the sharp shark teeth. Thanks so much Val for running this, it was a highlight for everyone!

Thanks Craig for bringing in some amazing Chinchilla wood and telling us about it.




Owen has finished faceting this Waiuta Stone with lessons at our workshop.
