# Letter from the competition judge

Hello everyone, July marks the beginning of a new year of competitions. This year the committee has decided to spice things up with a new category. We hope you're all excited for "**Agate Arena**"! Seeing that we are the "agate club" we thought it was high time to have a dedicated agate category in the monthly competitions. Much like the other categories, each month, a new agate type will be introduced into the arena. Members are encouraged to bring any agates that fit the brief to come and show off their finds. Since I have your attention, I thought I'd take a moment to explain how I judge entries in the monthly competitions. Judging isn't always easy, and I often find myself struggling to decide the top three placements in each category. To help me along in the process, I have a few loose rules that I try to follow.

- 1. Originality: I love entries that are different and not just your usual slabbed or polished specimens. I often say that if someone brought in a polished cube or a set of dice made from rocks, it would be an instant first place!
- **2. Self-found and made:** I tend to rate entries higher if they're found and worked on by the entrant, rather than bought or swapped from someone else.
- **3. Effort:** This has some overlap with the first two points, but I also tend to rank entries higher if I can see that the effort has been put in!
- **4.** Looks good: Pretty rocks win competitions! Enough said.

Towards the end of the last competition cycle, I had been seeing an increased interest and more entries from people who normally don't bring anything in. While this is awesome, I'd love to see **even more entries this year!** We have over 100 members in the club but only 4 or 5 people regularly enter in competitions... We can't let John Taylor win every category again this year, so I'm calling on more people to bring their specimens along on club nights!
