Hotel History of the CMLC

Did you hear we once had our very own hotel in Blackball?

Two of our CMLC members, recently in the area of Blackball, found evidence located at the back of the hotel of the club's historic connections to Blackball. (They did ask for permission before snooping around)

Blackball, a pint-sized town on New Zealand's South Island West Coast, is just a hop and skip (29 km) away from Greymouth. It's got a spicy political past with mine strikes, but that's a tale for another day. Today, let's dive into the historic pub formerly known as the Blackball Lodge, the Dominion Hotel, BlackBall Hilton and now the Formerly the Blackball Hilton Hotel.

Initially, Blackball was a pit stop for gold-hungry adventurers, but by 1893, it morphed into a coal-mining hub. Fast forward to the swinging '60s, and mining wasn't the cash cow it used to be. With tech changing the game and coal demand dropping, the mine shut in 1964, leaving behind a ghost town. From a bustling 830 residents, the population shrank to 331 by 1971.

Meanwhile, back in Christchurch, 1964 saw the birth of The Canterbury Mineral and Lapidary Club. But Blackball was hitting a rough patch, and the Dominion Hotel closed its doors. In a quirky farewell, the hotel license was ceremoniously buried in the basement by the retiring Mrs. Fleming at 10 pm, with a crowd of onlookers.

Check out this historic hotel below or if you're in the area. You may want to try some of their delicious food,

or stand by the fire to warm yourself up a little, with maybe a pint to keep you hydrated

Enter the Lapidary Club, swooping in like superheroes in July 1968 to snatch up the rundown hotel for a whopping \$551.50, turning it into a rock-hunting HQ for those going over to the West Coast.

A club member, Chris, recalls the hotel's purchase tales, musing, "It either came with a gold claim or we snagged it because of the claim." He also vividly remembers the Inangahua quake in 1968, with his metal bed doing a jig at 5:30 a.m. Constructed in 1910 by publican Jas Irvine, The Dominion Hotel thrived during Blackball's coal boom, serving as a hub for miners. Over time, it changed hands and names—most notably in the 1970s when Mike Graham dubbed it the Blackball Hilton. Fast forward to 1994, when a legal nudge from Hilton Hotels led to its current name: Formerly The Blackball Hilton. It now has earned a spot as a Category 2 historic landmark. Nowadays, current CMCL members might spot a rock display at the pub's entrance. When asked, owner Cynthia said, "The rocks were just on a
