

Matariki Project

Thank you to everybody who brought along their wonderful worked Matariki Stone at the last general meeting. The creativity and quality of the lapidary work was incredible. I'm sure Craig McGregor would have been impressed! The wonderful entries will have a solidified position in the club cabinet near the back of the room.

The results of this competition will be announced at the August general meeting.

This beautiful stone is a garnet and amphibole schist that Craig McGregor

coined 'Matariki stone. It is a naturally occurring metamorphic rock that is found on the beaches and rivers around Haast on the west coast region of the South Island. Albeit a common stone in the area, finding good quality material that falls into lapidary grade can be a challenge to come by. The stone is comprised of several minerals, being quartz, feldspar, amphibole, and garnet.

The pieces shown in these photos are great examples and really show the beauty of this unique metamorphic stone.

If you want to get your hands on a piece of this material, an exceptionally crafted sphere was kindly donated by Robin Hall for a prize for an upcoming raffle.




